- Confirmation of Council commitment

- Exploration of options to enhance service provision
- Commitment to expedite the project given previous delays



#### **Progress Since March Meeting**

- Brief agreed for Architects for high level options
- Tendered for Architects and appointed Make
- Tendered and appointed cost consultants (Faithfull & Gould) and Legal firm



#### Approaches to the design brief

- Included the requirement for leisure provision including a swimming pool and library provision (relocated Marylebone Library).
- Included the requirement for flexible multi-functional community spaces (and appended the information received from the Marylebone Mums & Dads Group).
- Included a requirement to include flexible space for additional council services.
- Included the desire to activate street frontages and ensure wider public realm benefit
- Included the council's accessibility requirements and net zero carbon targets, recognising that the building is listed.




