



Pre-school Playgroups



Pre-schools, also known as playgroups or playschools, provide care and early learning for children aged 2-5. They are registered with Ofsted and inspected every three years. Pre-schools offer sessional care, either morning or afternoon sessions. Pre-school staff work out with children and parents often help out. There is a range of play activities for children and lots of opportunities to learn.

Plus points:

- Your child can enjoy learning and playing in a small group.
- Children can acquire skills for a head start at school.
- You can get to know other parents in the area.

FAQ's

How many children will there be in the pre-school?

Most pre-schools will provide place for between 10-20 children. There should be no more than 26 children in one room.

When are pre-schools open?

Pre-schools are open for either morning or afternoon sessions. Sometimes there will be two sessions a day five days a week, sometimes the pre-school will just open once or twice a week. Most pre-schools have the same term dates as local schools.

How much does a pre-school cost?

Pre-school costs vary. Some provide free early education places for 3 and 4 year olds with the Nursery Education Grant.
