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Purpose

Westminster City Council and Victoria BID commissioned Night Time Economy Solutions to conduct a comprehensive overnight assessment of women's safety during the evening and nighttime economy hours.

This report presents the findings of an overnight audit conducted in Victoria. The district's vibrant nightlife, which includes world-famous West End theatres, bars, and restaurants, offers a distinctive experience for residents and visitors alike. This audit provides a detailed examination of various aspects influencing the safety of women and girls during the night in Victoria, shedding light on both the positive aspects and challenges that define the area's nighttime economy. The findings of this audit aim to create a comprehensive understanding of the safety considerations for women and girls in Victoria.

This report provides actionable recommendations for all stakeholders involved, outlining strategies to enhance the safety and wellbeing of women in Westminster during nighttime activities.

Aims

- 01 Assess the safety of women and girls. Undertake a thorough evaluation of women and girls' safety within Westminster's nighttime activities, encompassing the viewpoints of visitors, employees, and residents.
- 02 Comprehend women's experiences. Acquire insights into the experiences and perspectives of women and girls in the area, particularly regarding their interactions within Westminster's nighttime scene.
- 03 Identify crucial safety concerns. Highlight specific safety issues confronted by women, including both physical locations and social interactions within Westminster's nighttime activities.
- 04 Offer targeted recommendations. Present practical recommendations and strategies for all relevant parties, delineating actionable steps to enhance the safety and wellbeing of women and girls in Victoria.
- 05 Promote ongoing enhancement. Establish a framework for continuous improvement, allowing for the tracking and assessment of implemented measures, focusing on long-term safety improvements for women and girls in the community.

Audit Findings

An overnight audit was performed as part of the Westminster work initiative in Victoria commissioned by Westminster City Council and Victoria BID. This took place on Saturday, 20th May 2023.

This audit involved a comprehensive examination of various facets of the evening and nighttime economy, aiming to assess the impact of these factors on the experience of women's safety during nighttime activities.

The overnight audit revealed a distinct disparity in the levels of venue governance. This inconsistency in how businesses and hospitality venues manage their operations during the night has significant implications for patrons' overall safety and security.

The varying levels of venue governance could be indicative of the effectiveness of safety measures currently in place. Some establishments demonstrated more robust protocols and well-trained staff dedicated to ensuring the wellbeing of their customers. However, on the opposite end of the spectrum, there were venues where governance appeared disorganised, and safety measures were either inadequately enforced or underemphasised.

This contrast became particularly apparent when addressing concerns such as outdoor venues and crowd management, patron dispersal, and glasses and bottles being taken outdoors. It is worth remarking that the presence of inactive workers, including security door staff and venue staff, could exacerbate these issues. This inactivity may stem from a lack of proper training in handling various situations, further highlighting the importance of comprehensive staff education and training to maintain safety and security in nightlife establishments.

The effectiveness of safety measures in Victoria's establishments is heavily dependent on the knowledge and skills of the staff responsible for maintaining order and ensuring the well-being of patrons. Training to help ensure and maintain venue governance should be better recorded and instilled as a standard practice. This means that all personnel working in nightlife venues should receive comprehensive training to handle various situations, especially during nighttime hours.

Businesses, safety initiatives (such as Soho Pubwatch and Super Pubwatch), and local authorities should work in unison to set and enforce a standard for venue governance. This collaboration can lead to a safer and more enjoyable nightlife experience for all patrons, irrespective of the type of establishment they choose to visit. An issue that came to light is the challenge of effectively engaging businesses in these endeavours, underscoring the pressing need for more streamlined communication and collaboration amongst all stakeholders to ensure optimal safety protocols are in place.

Audit Findings

The prevalence of homelessness in various public areas raises immediate safety concerns, particularly for women and girls. Interventions such as outreach programmes, addiction support services, and urban planning strategies are imperative to transform these areas into more secure and welcoming spaces. Addressing these issues directly impacts consumers and helps ensure the navigation of public spaces without feeling vulnerable or at risk.

The challenges associated with homelessness and its related issues appear to have been exacerbated by several factors. Council efforts to coordinate soup kitchens with multiple charities have encountered obstacles, with some charities declining to participate and others open to cooperating effectively. Mediation between charities to streamline services and support for those in need is a crucial factor in evolving the efficiency and effectiveness of this service.

Furthermore, while offering assistance, charities also face limitations in their approaches. The provision of tents to individuals experiencing homelessness can, unfortunately, contribute to the likelihood of maintaining a street-based lifestyle. This situation has, tragically, resulted in deaths and sexual assaults among those affected. In some instances, sex work has even occurred within the tents, compounding the safety concerns.

One significant gap in addressing homelessness and its related issues is the absence of public safety officers (PSOs) specifically dedicated to homelessness concerns. Existing bylaws are unable to address these challenges effectively, and there is a reluctance to employ PSOs due to limitations on enforcement powers. As an alternative, community notices could be considered as a means of monitoring and regulating activities, ensuring those who need support are helped while those involved in harmful or illegal activities are appropriately addressed.

Improving the public realm is important to address a range of safety and vibrancy concerns. These enhancements serve as the cornerstone for crafting a more inviting and inclusive environment during the evening and at night.

The audit has highlighted a distinct lack of vibrancy in the area, particularly at night when it can feel somewhat sterile. Contributing factors include the absence of diverse activities, limited walking routes, and persisting public realm issues. Creating appealing spaces and well-lit walkways plays a pivotal role in transforming Victoria into a lively and thriving hub.

A critical facet of this transformation involves the underutilisation of lighting. Many areas of Victoria, including Christchurch Gardens, lack sufficient lighting at night, potentially compromising safety. Implementing strategic improvements in lighting infrastructure, complemented by periodic patrols, can enhance safety. This, in turn, fosters a more inclusive atmosphere, ensuring that individuals of all genders feel at ease and secure during their nocturnal visits. It is worth highlighting that dimly lit areas like Lower Robert Street offer opportunities for enhancement, particularly as pedestrians frequently use car parks as shortcuts to the Embankment. Rejuvenating these locations by incorporating improved and/or creative lighting bolsters safety and contributes to a more animated and inviting ambience.

Regarding the specific concerns in King's Scholar's Passage, it's evident that this area is a hotspot for nighttime criminal activities, characterised by open gates, drug dealing and drug use. There is a reliance on private security contractors and CCTV-specific lighting to improve safety; however, even then, this is only on one side of the road.

Audit Findings

A potential resolution may involve establishing a service agreement with the CCTV housing solution centre and nearby hostels. Encouraging residents to report crimes, addressing the issue of rubbish, and installing secure gates are imperative steps. Furthermore, developing a design proposal for the street which aligns with the broader public realm improvements is essential. This undertaking requires securing initial funding and exploring avenues for continuous financial support. Managing the CCTV infrastructure will also necessitate a dedicated controller.

Additionally, the audit highlighted issues regarding waste collection services and the service provider for most (if not all) West End theatres. Ideally, waste bins should undergo daily collection, but it appears bins are often left unattended, and waste is only taken outside as needed. It was noted that efforts are underway to transition to a different service provider through potential incentives such as offering discounted services.

According to The Railway Data Centre, in 2021/2022, London Victoria Station recorded 36,776,338 entries and exits, making it the second most utilised station in Great Britain. However, despite the high footfall, Victoria remains primarily a commercialised area, with an obvious absence of compelling incentives for both consumers and tourists to extend their stay in the district once their immediate tasks or activities are complete.

To unlock the full potential of Victoria as a vibrant and thriving hub, there is a pressing need to diversify the range of activities and services available throughout the early evening and night. The presence of numerous vacant shops in Victoria poses a challenge since many of these properties are privately owned, making it more complex to repurpose them for community and cultural use. Furthermore, the commercial landscape in Victoria appears to be dominated by larger businesses, with a shortage of independent establishments that could infuse diversity into the area's character and offerings.

For the most part, Victoria functions as a business district, catering primarily to tourists and serving as a thoroughfare for commuters rather than a destination. This trend reflects the need for a strategic shift to reposition Victoria as a sought-after locale for leisure and entertainment. However, it's important to note that Victoria boasts numerous heritage elements, such as the Strutton Ground food market, which enrich its cultural tapestry. Yet, these destinations remain underappreciated and underutilised, suggesting a need for more effective promotion and visibility to tap into their potential to enhance Victoria's overall charm and appeal.
