## The future of Ebury Bridge is about more than bricks and mortar

Westminster City Council's vision for housing is about people and families having the chance to make a life in Westminster and not having to leave as their families grow. It is also about ensuring the city remains home to vibrant mixed communities that comprise people of all ages, income levels and backgrounds.

At Ebury Bridge, should we proceed with a development option, we have the opportunity to deliver more affordable housing, both for social and intermediate rent, to address overcrowding on the estate, and to provide better living environments for residents.

In addition, the council is working with the local shop owners to ensure we respond to their needs in any proposals.

We recognise that processes such as this are unsettling for residents. However if we want more and better homes, and to sustain vibrant mixed local communities in Westminster who can make their lives here long into the future - we need to continue to renew and refresh the housing we provide. We look forward to working with the community to create a sustainable, viable proposal that makes the Ebury Bridge Estate an even better place to live.

## Key pledges

Should we proceed with a development option:

- A right of return for residents is guaranteed for all secure tenants and resident leaseholders
- There will be a full replacement of all council homes
- In addition, 35% of any new homes provided will be affordable for social and intermediate rent
- Addressing overcrowding is a top priority
- Good local shopping that serves local communities is central
- Ebury Bridge will remain a council-owned estate
- Residents will be at the heart of developing a viable new scheme

## First Call Independent Advisors

First Call Housing are the Independent Residents' Advisor for council tenants and leaseholders on the Ebury Estate and can provide you with free independent advise on rehousing and buyback options, should your block form part of any new scheme for Ebury. First Call has been working with Ebury residents for some time and already know the estate and community very well.

First Call Housing can visit you at home or on the estate at a time of your convenience, and from 18th September will be available at the Community Engagement Centre on Mondays between 2pm and 4pm. No prior appointment is needed.

## Ebury Bridge Community Futures Group

## Resident in Focus... Mike Smith



Mike set up and has run a gardening club on the estate for residents which has been growing from strength to strength over the last 10 years. The community gardens are situated behind Doneraile House and run from the 'The Lodge'. The Ebury Gardening Club is not only helping many residents become 'green fingered' but also shares a great deal of knowledge with local school groups who come to learn more about growing flowers and vegetables.

Mike Smith, Ebury Bridge resident, said:

"From that seed of an idea, the success of our club at Ebury has grown and grown, largely due to the commitment and energy of our members. Working together, we have achieved a scheme to be proud of – a place where people can enjoy the beautiful surroundings."

# Your questions answered.

## If I speak to the Community Engagement Team, will this result in my block being knocked down?

No. The Community Engagement Team are currently working with residents and businesses as part of the Listening Period. It is important that your views on the future of Ebury Bridge are heard so do please get in contact with the team.

## If my family is required to move, will we move close to the Ebury area? We are worried that we may have to find a new school to attend.

Residents are able to exercise choice about which properties they bid on. We fully appreciate that those currently living on the estate will have established networks and connections in the local area over time. If you are required to move, we will meet with you to listen to your needs and requests when completing your housing needs assessment.

It has been our experience on previous regeneration schemes within Westminster, that parents are not typically required to change their child/children's school.

## Will I be moved into temporary accommodation (bed and breakfast), a council home within Westminster or to another borough outside London?

As a secure tenant, you will have choice of where to move within the borough of Westminster. Secure tenants would not be rehoused in B&B accommodation should they be required to be moved.

All secure tenants who are rehoused due to the regeneration will have the right of return, which allows them to come back to the estate once the new homes are completed.

## How long will the development take?

We are currently speaking to residents about their ideas for the future of Ebury Bridge. The length of time any development will take depends on the options developed and which preferred option is taken forward.

We will continue to communicate with all residents throughout the regeneration process to ensure residents remain fully informed.

## As a resident leaseholder, if I take the option for an Equity Stake in a new home on Ebury, will I be able to rent the flat out?

Any new lease agreement offered by the council will be in line with the terms as the current existing Westminster Council leases.

Should you choose to sub-let your property, you can apply to do so, in the same way as you would now.

## We have an Ebury gardening community, will there be an area for them in a new development?

Yes. The Ebury Bridge Community Garden is a much loved community asset. We will ensure that this is acknowledged in the design options process.

## When we move back will there be a rent increase?

Any secure tenant required to be rehoused as a result of any new scheme for Ebury will return to Ebury on a social rent.

## A ground floor flat has recently been secured in Victoria House. Does this mean that the council intend to knock this block down?


No. This was a vacant property that was secured after reports of suspicious activity.

There are no plans or proposals at this stage for any block on the estate and we continue to listen to the community throughout the Listening Period.

This feedback will inform the next stages of the process,

which includes working with the community to explore the options for the estate.

Proposals for the estate could include refurbishment of the existing blocks through to building new homes and these options will be explored during Phase 3 – Create options through engagement.
