

HOARDINGS ERECTED TO PREPARE FOR WORK AT EDGSON HOUSE

It's hard to miss the new hoardings around Edgson House. The white wooden boards have been put in place to ensure the safety of residents whilst work is carried out to remove the building.

This is an important step towards a new future for Ebury Bridge.

We want to minimise disruption to all Ebury Bridge Estate households as much as possible. Contractors will consider and manage:

Dust: By enclosing the scaffolding and dampening debris, contractors will reduce

dust escaping the site. We will also regularly monitor dust levels.

Noise: Our contractors will only work during normal working hours and noise will be monitored by independent inspectors to minimise excessive disruption.

Access and safety: Residents with car permits to the estate will be unaffected and supervisors will patrol the estate to ensure safety of all residents.

YOUR HOUSING PREFERENCES

Over the past few months, if you are a secure tenant or leaseholder you will have received a letter requesting your housing preference for the future, followed by a visit from a re-housing officer. The purpose of this visit was so that you could let us know what type of new home you would like, and whether you would like this to be on the new Ebury estate or elsewhere in Westminster.

We've reviewed all the preferences you provided and all secure tenants should now be able to look at the Choice Based Lettings

system and view available properties. Thank you to everyone who has filled out the form. If anyone has any questions about its content, please get in touch with the Ebury Bridge Regeneration Base.

During home visits residents may have also been asked some questions about the characteristics of members of your household (age, sex, housing situation, etc). Please be assured, these questions are to help us appropriately support households and all data is stored on a strictly confidential basis.

We have written to all leaseholders about whether they wish to consider selling to the council by agreement. This means being prepared to start conversations about your options for the future. We'd like to know your housing preference, including whether you want to move to one of the newly built properties. It is important that you let us know by returning the form.

GIVE SOME OF YOUR TIME TO THE FUTURE OF EBURY

The Ebury Bridge renewal project is gathering pace and 2019 will see a host of new opportunities for you to help shape the design of the new look estate, such as choosing which contractors we will work with and what type of activities you would like as part of the 'meanwhile' use space.

In the New Year we will be inviting residents across the estate to sign-up for specific project groups known as 'Task and Finish' groups. These groups will make big recommendations on smaller projects. They will advise the council on each

project area and engage with their local neighbours to hear their views.

The Ebury project team would really welcome volunteers for these groups and we are looking for help from residents with:

Designing your new home: Now the number and concept of new homes has been roughly identified it is time to add the detail! We want a team of residents to work with the architects to suggest ideas for external finishes, internal layouts, communal gardens and any other design feature you can think of.

Selecting who we work with: We need residents to help us hire the right

contractors. Residents will help to interview them, test their approach and give views on their previous work before putting pen to paper.

Meanwhile use: The vacant Edgson House plot will provide us with a brilliant opportunity to create an exciting community space. You can help us design, build and manage the meanwhile facilities.

This is a great opportunity for you to develop an interest, add to your CV or gain experience for a possible future career!

COMMUNITIES FIRST – YOUR INDEPENDENT ADVISORS

Communities First are your Independent Advisors for the Ebury Bridge regeneration project, working with residents and Westminster City Council.

Their role is to provide free independent and confidential advice to tenants and leaseholders on the Ebury Bridge Estate about the implications of the regeneration proposals. The Communities First team are Louis Blair and Ian Simpson, who are experienced in supporting residents in Ebury Bridge and elsewhere on regeneration projects. The team can provide general information on the design, planning and regeneration process as well as one to one advice for individual residents.

Ian and Louis can advise council tenants on rehousing options, tenancy and rehousing rights, compensation issues and rent and service charge policy. Communities First can advise leaseholders on the buyback process, equity share

and loan options, new home options, valuations, compensation, the Compulsory Purchase (CPO) process and your rights. They can also provide advice and support to private tenants, those living in temporary accommodation and business owners.

They are available to visit Ebury residents at home at a time of your convenience or join you at meetings or viewings with council officers. They are also available for one to one advice every Monday 3–5pm in the Regeneration Base.
