- Supports Fairer Westminster to, "Strengthen the role of voluntary sector and community groups in leading the green transformation in our neighbourhoods"
- The programme has three key objectives to improve and increase the:
 - QUANTITY of green assets across the city
 - QUALITY of our open spaces + green infrastructure
 - IMPACT of our green assets, delivering a range of benefits to individuals, communities and the environment.

 - A partnership approach
 - Community focused projects

Lisson Green Estate, Community Allotments

- The Church Street Regeneration
 Programme secured funding in 2021 to revitalise the pocket parks of Lisson Green Estate in Church Street.
- Council officers worked with Community Delivery Partners, Groundwork and the Hammersmith Community Garden Association
- Project better connected estate gardens, and provided ecological improvements.
- Encouraging greater resident engagement with community planting workshops.

Total project value: £66,640
 Programme grant: £50,000



St John's the Evangelist, Kensal Green

- Implemented a phased greening strategy at St John's, which includes transforming an unused tarmac yard into a new community green space
- Installation of mixed species plant beds, providing rich biodiversity for the church's pollinators, including two beehives!
- Six new benches provide places to reflect and absorb the tranquillity of the grounds.
- The greening of the surrounding church gardens, including planting yew hedges known to combat air pollution from the road.

Total project value: £62,000
 Programme grant: £32,000

George's Park, Baker Street


- A new public green space providing some much-needed green space for local workers and residents to enjoy during their breaks.
- Transformed an unused and unloved space into a parklet.
- The project is an excellent example of a shared vision successfully delivered through collaborative partnerships.
- Total project value: £33,000
 Programme grant: £15,500


Fairer Environment

- Introducing an additional 600 secure cycle parking spaces by the end of March 2023 to encourage more people to cycle.
- Installing 1,000 more electric vehicle charge points by 2024 to make low emission travel more attractive.
- Launching the Sustainable City Charter, a joint commitment to help drive action across the city to address the carbon impact of our buildings and to secure their sustainability.

- Completing an Environmental Justice Measure to understand how we can remove the barriers residents face to accessing green spaces, sustainable transport and recycling.
- Launching a Community Municipal Investment Bond, so residents can invest in projects that tackle climate change.
- Engaging with communities and residents on greening projects across the city.



Environmental Justice Measure



Westminster's Environmental Justice Measure (EJM) is a data tool which aims to:

- Highlight differences in how people are impacted by their environment and climate change.
- Show the distribution of green, sustainable resources and spaces across the City.
- Give residents the information they need to act, influence and reduce negative environmental impacts.
- Inform the Council about where and how we invest in the local environment.

Why is it important for Greening Westminster?

- By sharing this tool with our communities, awareness of climate and environmental impacts can be incorporated into proposals
- The EJM will help us focus resources to where they are needed most

Climate Action in Westminster





Green and Resilient City

- Maintain, plant and protect council trees to support long-term increase in tree canopy cover
- Inspire residents, communities and organisations to increase tree planting
- Support greening within public realm schemes to help enhance carbon sinks and provide climate resilience
- Engage and enable residents and organisations to understand and increase their resilience to local climate impacts and extreme weather events

Westminster City Council declared an Ecological Emergency in September 2023



This declaration is a result of acknowledging the stress that high carbon emissions have placed on global nature and ecosystems and the impact this has had on Westminster's plants and wildlife. It also reflects our commitment to protect and bolster the natural world. This declaration builds on the declaration of the climate emergency announced in 2019, acknowledging the links between the two crises and that by dealing with both at the same time, we stand a better chance of reducing the long-term damage caused.

A Nature and Urban Ecology Strategy will be published by end of 2024

Who can apply?



The Greening Westminster Programme is open to any organisation that wishes to improve or increase the quantity, quality or impact of green assets across the City.

The funding programme accepts different types of applicants which fall into two different funding streams:


Greening Westminster Professional
Applications from Professional entities, eg.
Business Improvement Districts (BIDs),
private businesses/organisations, or
internal Westminster City Council teams,

Greening Westminster Communities
Applications from Grassroots
Organisations/Community groups.

Eligibility - Application Criteria

To be eligible to apply for Greening Westminster funding, you must meet the following criteria:

- the project site must be in Westminster
- the project site must be publicly accessible
- the project must be completed by June 2025
- future maintenance and management must be considered





Priority Projects

Programme will prioritise projects that:

- focus on community greening projects that serve and strengthen local communities
- focus on need outlined in the Environmental Justice Measure
- consider the environmental impact by putting in place appropriate measures to reduce the carbon footprint and ensure climate resilience
- demonstrate improvements to biodiversity
- have a clear approach to maintenance and management to ensure the longevity of the project
- that can demonstrate additional support from volunteer time and community buy-in



Application Process

Step 1 – Submit an Expression of Interest (EoI) via the link on the website – www.greeningwestminster.gov.uk

We will:

- check against eligibility criteria
- categorise into "Community" or "Professional" application
- send appropriate application form directly to applicant's email address


Step 2 – Submit an Application Form by sending via email to greeningwestminster@westminster.gov.uk

- Sign up to a 1:1 officer meeting if you need advice or support on any aspect of your application




Two page form on the Greening Westminster website covering:

About your organisation

- Name
- Address
- Legal Status of Organisation
- Using the description tell us which funding stream you think you fall into?
- Outline your organisation and project concept
- All applications are encouraged to source match funding. In the case of Greening Westminster Professional stream it is an obligation to provide at least 20% match funding




Eligibility criteria:

- Is your project publicly accessible?
- Does you project deliver physical improvements? The grant does not support hypothetical proposals
- Will your project be delivered in Westminster? The grant does not support projects outside the borough of Westminster.
- Have you considered how your project will be managed and maintained?

Must answer "yes" to each to receive an application form

Step 2 - Submit a full funding application via email at greeningwestminster@westminster.gov.uk

What next?

What happens after your application is submitted?

- You will receive a confirmation email that your application has been received
- Applications will be reviewed internally and scored according to priorities set out on the website
- Applicants will be informed via email as to the success of their application by early June 2024

What happens if your application is unsuccessful?

- You will be given some feedback in an email
- We look forward to receiving a revised or different application from you in future years



What happens if your application is successful?

- You will be informed of your successful application and sent an Agreement to sign, which will include conditions of grant. The signed Agreement must be returned to the Council
- You will be invited to a "kick-off" meeting to discuss how you intend to progress your project

If you are a "Community" applicant:

 You may be introduced to a Community Delivery Partner (CDP) who will help you to develop your project and advise on how to deliver it. CDPs will be allocated to community applicants on a need-only basis

If you are a "Professional" applicant:

You will be required to submit evidence of your partnership funding

All applicants:

- You will be required to submit updates on progress with your project throughout the year
- You will need to complete your project by June 2025
