## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Osborne are putting up the concrete frame for the new building, which will take two months to complete. There is also mechanical, electrical and plumbing work taking place alongside this.

Over the next few weeks there will be some concrete pouring works which require vehicles coming and going from site. We believe the works taking place should not be excessively disruptive to residents at this time. #### SITE WORKING HOURS

Normal working hours are:

Monday – Friday: 8am – 6pm

Saturday: 8am - 1pm

#### SAFETY ON SITE

Shorne are following the Government's recommendation to continue construction and are working with the council to apply the guidance given by Public Health England (PHE) on social distancing. The work is being reviewed regularly and we will keep you up to date with the latest information.

The site was temporarily shut down in March and again in April to assess whether it would be safe to continue working. Osborne have undertaken an extensive risk assessment and have produced a manual of best practice for workers on site to ensure safety and to prevent the spread of coronavirus.

Osborne have implemented Site Operating Procedures provided by the Construction Leadership Council. The guidance allows for workers to be within two metres of each other.

Osborne have put in place several practical measures to ensure safety and prevent the spread of coronavirus, these include:

- ➤ Parking spaces for additional cars and bicycles to ensure workers do not need to take public transport to site.
- ➤ Two metre distancing is being carried out across the site. A 'work buddy' system has been introduced where workers

living in the same household can work in close proximity to each other.

- ➤ More frequent hand-washing on site with an alcohol-based hand rub or soap and water through the provision of hand-washing and sanitising stations.
- ► Additional cleaning has been arranged, targeting surfaces that are likely to be touched regularly.
- ➤ The workforce has been reduced and an additional welfare cabin has been introduced to assist with social distancing during breaks and lunch.
- ➤ A one way system has been implemented for moving around the site, meaning that workers do not have to pass each other.
- ➤ Additional health and safety training has been delivered to all site workers reminding them to be mindful of others external to the immediate site, ensuring that social distancing takes place.
- Fingerprint scanners have been deactivated.

We will continue to follow Government guidance and work with Osborne to ensure the safety of everyone involved.

#### YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

## I'm following the government guidance by staying at home, will the works be noisy?

Osborne are currently putting up the concrete frame for the new building, which will take two months to complete. This work does not require use of noisy equipment. There will be some concrete pouring works in the coming weeks which require vehicles coming and going from site. The work should be minimally disruptive to residents who are at home during the day.

Osborne have an agreement with the council to not exceed agreed noise and vibration levels. On site three environmental monitoring stations have been installed by the council's Environmental Health team.

### Will the coronavirus cause a delay to the completion of Parsons North?

Parsons North is set to be completed in Summer 2021. We are still working towards this completion date, although this may change if the Government guidance recommends site closures. Our priority remains the safety of our residents and we will work with Osborne to ensure we are doing everything possible to keep people safe and healthy.

### Will construction at Parsons North continue to follow a normal timetable?

In light of the Government's latest guidance, construction will continue working to a normal timetable. On Monday-Friday the site hours will be 8am-6pm and 8am-1pm on Saturday.

#### How will you keep us updated?

We regularly communicate and engage with residents through letters, newsletters and other forms of communication. On the ground engagement is currently postponed, but we will remain available for residents to contact us and will keep our residents informed as the situation progresses.
