# STATEMENT OF REPRESENTATIONS PROCEDURE FOR THE BELGRAVIA NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN (REGULATION 16)

The Belgravia Neighbourhood Forum has submitted a proposed Neighbourhood Plan to Westminster City Council. The Council is now seeking views and comments from residents and interested stakeholders on the proposed plan, in line with Regulation 16 of the Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (as amended).

#### **Title of Document**

Belgravia Neighbourhood Plan 2023-2040 Submission Version.

# **Subject Matter and Area Covered**

The Belgravia Neighbourhood Forum and Neighbourhood Area were originally designated by Westminster City Council in 2014 and redesignated in 2019. The Belgravia Neighbourhood Plan sets out new planning policies for the development and use of land in the Belgravia Neighbourhood Area (shown in Figure 1 below or by reviewing our interactive Neighbourhood Planning Map at this <a href="link">link</a>) to the year 2040. It includes policies on a range of matters including character, heritage, design, sustainability, land use, cultural uses, major development sites and the environment.

### Period within which representations must be made

Representations on the Belgravia Neighbourhood Plan Submission Version and supporting documents must be made between 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2023 and 24<sup>th</sup> July 2023 (extended from an original closure of 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023).

### Making a representation

When making your representations please make clear which document your comment relates to and, if possible, the specific paragraph or policy you are referring to and its page number.

You should consider in particular whether the Plan meets the 'Basic Conditions' (set out below). The Basic Conditions Statement submitted by the Neighbourhood Forum, alongside the draft Neighbourhood Plan, explains how the Plan has sought to meet statutory requirements.

All of the representations received within the consultation period will be forwarded to the appointed Examiner to consider during the independent examination of the Plan. The Examiner will decide if oral representations are necessary, and who has a right to be heard, or if the examination can be conducted solely through written representations.

Please state in your representation whether you wish to participate in a public hearing if one is held.

Following the examination, the Council will consider the Examiner's recommendations and decide whether any changes are necessary to ensure the Plan meets the Basic Conditions. If these changes are approved, the Plan will then go to referendum for residents of the neighbourhood area to decide if it should be used by the Council when making planning decisions. If approved, it will then become part of Westminster's statutory development plan and will be used alongside the Council's own planning documents, such as the City Plan 2019-2040 and the Mayor's London Plan (2021) in determining planning applications in the Belgravia Neighbourhood Area.

Please state in your representation if you wish to be notified of the Councils' final decision in relation to the Plan.

The **Basic Conditions Statement** sets out how the Forum consider the Neighbourhood Plan meets the requirements set out in legislation, which are tested through the independent examination. In order to meet the Basic Conditions, a Neighbourhood Plan must:

- have regard to national policies and advice contained in guidance issued by the Secretary of State;
- contribute to the achievement of sustainable development;
- be in general conformity with the strategic policies of the development plan for the area:
- be compatible with EU obligations (including the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Directive) and human rights requirements; and

• ensure the prescribed conditions are met and prescribed matters have been complied with in connection with the proposal for the order.
