

STARTING THE WESTMEAD DEVELOPMENT MAIN WORKS

e hope you've had a lovely summer, enjoying the last of the sunny weather! Following the successful demolition of the former Westmead care home, we are thrilled to announce that we will be moving forward to the next phase of the project which will be to build the 65 new affordable homes for local people and associated landscaping works.

The project team have now completed the tender process for the main works contract and are pleased to announce that Willmott Dixon Ltd have been successfully selected as the preferred contractor to deliver the scheme. The next phase of the development will be to progress the technical design and discharge planning conditions before starting on site scheduled end of this year.

SITE OPERATING HOURS

ite operating hours are between 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday and between 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. No works will be carried out on Sundays or bank holidays, unless for emergency works.

Start-up and close-down periods of up to an hour before and after the above working hours may be required for activities such as:

- Arrival of workforce and staff
- · Deliveries and unloading
- Maintenance, fuelling and checking of plant and machinery

- Site inspections and safety checks prior to commencing work
- Morning coordination/prestart meetings
- General site clean-up
- Departure of workforce and staff


Should there be a special requirement to work outside of these prescribed times, the contractor Willmot Dixon Ltd will seek formal permission from the Code of Construction Practice Team and will inform residents prior to doing so.



SITE SET UP AND SECURITY

ite accommodation and welfare facilities will be provided for staff to minimise the impact of pedestrian traffic around the site during the busy periods of the day.

A protective scaffold will be erected over the public footpath to enable pedestrian foot traffic to continue as usual during lifting operations.



HOW ARE WE MANAGING TRAFFIC



illmot Dixon LTD will manage all construction deliveries from the access road and site gate with vehicle and traffic marshals.

- Deliveries are scheduled between 8am and 5pm, avoiding peak traffic hours.
- To reduce noise and emissions, vehicle engines will be off when stationary.
- Should any drivers bypass these measures, gatemen will be on-site from 7.30am to address concerns.
- Deliveries will be staggered so that, other than in unforeseen circumstances, drivers will be able to proceed directly to the site without the need to wait before proceeding to the site.
- Traffic Marshall will supervise all vehicles entering and exiting site and will ensure that all vehicles leaving the site have clean wheels to ensure that no deposits are left on the road.
