Processes like this are used all over the world


They are useful when agreement on a way forward isn't clear





The climate assembly has been commissioned as part of the council's efforts to address climate change.






- Cllr Noble will attend the last day of the assembly to receive your initial draft recommendations.
- Your draft report will be shared with you in early August.
- You will be invited to present your final report to the council's Climate Leadership Group (the Leader and Cabinet Members) in early September.
- Cllr Noble will then take the report to Full Council meeting in September.
- Assembly recommendations will inform an updated Climate Emergency Action Plan later in the autumn.










The Greenhouse effect







Yearly global surface temperature and atmospheric carbon dioxide (1850-2022)








RCP 4.5: Emissions stabilize by 2100










UNDERSTANDING WESTMINSTER'S CARBON FOOTPRINT <2.5% Industrial processes (inc waste)










Buildings account for 86% of Westminster's emissions


