

## Moving Traffic Enforcement in Westminster

All moving traffic contraventions enforced by Westminster City Council through our camera network, are based upon the information, instructions and road signs detailed within the [Highway Code](#).

If you have received a PCN for a moving traffic contravention, the images and camera footage associated with the PCN will be available for you to [view online](#).



The City Council has the authority to enforce moving traffic regulations through the use of camera enforcement under the London Local Authorities Act 2003 (as amended).

Signs are posted adjacent to relevant Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) signs, alerting drivers to camera enforcement coverage within that zone.

## Sat Nav

Please note that motorists should not solely rely on Sat Nav devices when driving and any directions given by a Sat Nav do not negate the requirement to comply with road signs.

## Signs Giving Orders

A PCN may be incurred when motorists fail to comply with traffic signs giving orders. Motorists are required to comply with these signs at all times, unless a diversion is in place or an exemption applies. See also, [Signs Giving Orders](#) from the Highway Code.

## Contravention Code 32

*“Failing to drive in the direction shown by the arrow on a blue sign.”*



Road signs indicating that vehicles are required to proceed or turn in a particular direction are on display at various junctions throughout Westminster.

## Contravention Code 50

*“Performing a prohibited turn.”*



Road signs indicating that a right, left or U- turn is not permitted are on display at various locations in Westminster.

## Contravention Code 52

*“Failing to comply with a prohibition on certain types of vehicles.”*

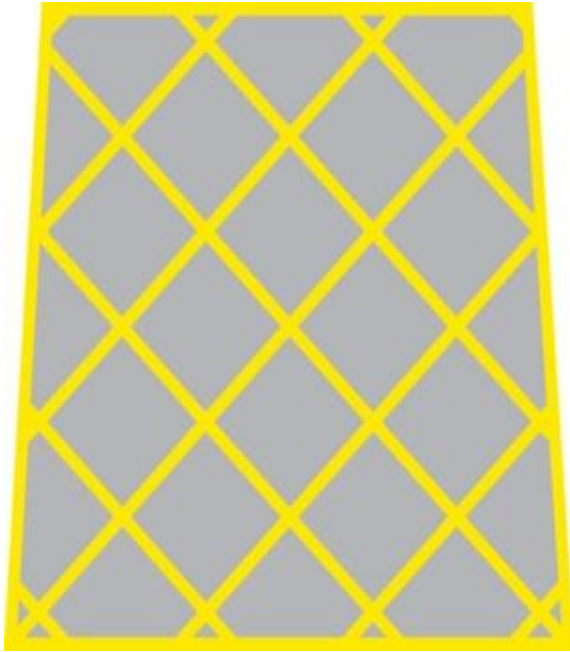


If a PCN is incurred while a vehicle is accessing a location that cannot be reached via an alternative route, then evidence should be supplied when challenging the PCN, such as a delivery note.

# Box Junctions

## Contravention Code 31

*“Entering and stopping in a box junction when prohibited.”*



A yellow box junction does not require any other signage.

Vehicles are not permitted to enter a box junction unless the exit is clear, or when turning right and delayed by oncoming traffic or by other vehicles waiting to turn right.

It is essential to keep box junctions clear in order to prevent accidents and maintain the free flow of traffic across the junction.

Do not simply follow the vehicle in front as it may stop and prevent your exit and don't let other drivers pressure you to enter the box when a clear exit is not available.
